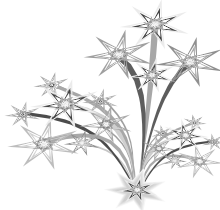

The Town of Star City is Born

“The first election for the new town was held on June 14, 1907 and, since there was but one slate of candidates, the result was not in doubt.

‘By a unanimous majority of thirty,’ the Morgantown Daily Post said on Saturday, June 15, 1907, ‘all the candidates on the first municipal ticket were elected Friday at Star City.’ Altogether, there were thirty votes cast, all for the citizens ticket. The vote will be canvassed this afternoon by Commissioners Napoleon Boothe, Henry Rettiger, and Samuel J. Boyles. Immediately after the declaration of the result, the newly elected officials will take the oath of office and will start in at once upon their duties.

Mayor-to-be David S. Brewer will appoint a special policeman, one of the first official acts. The policeman will at once take charge of the boxcar which the city has commissioned as a municipality lock-up. Upon hearing that the boxcar was to be used as a cooler, the local B& O agent telegraphed for a refrigerator car, which has not yet arrived.

E.E. Shriver will be the first Recorder, and the following councilmen will be convened some time next week for the first council meeting: G. B. Stansberry, R. C. McKinley, F. C. Shriver, U.G. Wright, and J. W. Kennedy.”

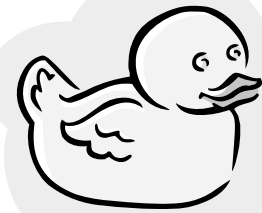
Second Annual Duck Race to benefit The Shack Neighborhood House
