-Mary Wimmer of Morgantown Area Paddlers/Kayak launch – Reported that the kayak launch is out of the river for the winter. Discussed a site visit from EZ-dock rep Jerry McEntire from NC and WVU landscape professor Haas to discuss bank erosion around the gazebo and site design.

CITIZENS:

-Lois Sellaro- 1292 Jacobs Drive read off a list of requirements that she was required to meet

when she built her apartment building 3 years ago on University Ave. and is inquiring about the building being built on University Ave. by Linda Kosten that doesn't appear to be under the same restrictions. The Mayor told her someone will get back to her on the issue.

- **-Bobby Doyle** -Springdale Ave.: Opposes Stafford Ave. being turned one way. Says we need to have more police presence instead and that many citizens will be inconvenienced if the street is turned one way.
- -Anthony Giambrone- Congress Ave.: Opposes Stafford Ave. being turned one way. Would like to see that Chief Varndell have a chance to get his squad together to start enforcing traffic since we have been understaffed for months.
- -Andrew Laskody- Broadway Ave.: Opposes Stafford Ave. being turned one way. Agrees that something needs to be done to slow traffic but this is not the answer. Does not approve of seeing police cruisers monitoring traffic on University Ave. during peak traffic hours when many cars are cutting through back streets.
- **-Denny Fox-** Boyer's Ave.: Opposes Stafford Ave. and explained his difficulties getting home and to his mothers house on Broadway.
- **-Jan Baniak** -443 Pleasant Hill Ave- explained that she thinks Stafford is dangerous and is in favor of the Stafford Ave. direction change.
